The area around the Ross Sea has been protected since 1961, but can be fished. And thanks to our Government, the extent of over-fishing is having dramatic consequences.

As the toothfish disappears, the effect on the food chain becomes even more critical – penguins, sea lions, fish species, whales. The Ross Sea is the last untouched ocean on the planet, and the race to stop fishing there is on.
